### Reply to Mr. Morey on Restoration or Desecration? By Richard Fritz

Who can argue with Merriam Webster on the definition of the word "restoration"? And, I thoroughly agree with Mr. Morey that the word is hardly ever used appropriately where automobiles are concerned.

I believe that automobiles in the 'highly prized', 'rare' and 'coveted by collectors' categories should be restored to the build standards they had when they were on the showroom floor. These are museum quality automobiles that often travel from show to show in better accommodations than their owners do. These are 'trophy cars'. They are million dollar art forms and no expense is spared to keep them that way.

Now there are the cars that you and I own; loved and revered just as much as their affluent cousins only delivering real enjoyment and satisfaction from being driven on the open road, or better still on a twisting country road. These cars are not thought of as a commodity but, more likely, a part of the family. They are connections to simpler days and memories that still make us smile. But, don't get me wrong... these cars are quite valuable in their own right, maybe not in dollars but still priceless. However, since these cars are being driven today and the characteristics of motoring has changed a lot since your 'baby' was manufactured several decades ago, the competency and safety of your vehicle has to be in question.

What's wrong with installing seat belts, switching to radial tires, using modern headlamps or adding an electronic ignition system and Weber carburetors if it improves the safety and reliability of your car? None of these improvements detract from the originality of the vehicle. Furthermore, if an owner wants to personalize their car, what's wrong with upgrading to period correct mirrors, a Moto-Lita steering wheel, auxiliary lighting, Panasport/Minilite wheels, and maybe even custom wire wheels? Again, none of these enhancements detract from the cars appearance or worth. In fact, I'm confident in saying these changes add to the cars visual appeal and performance satisfaction.

When the time comes to restore our 'old family friend', there are some decisions that need to be made, specifically... is it worth the price of a true restoration relative to the real value of the car? A full restoration will likely be two or three times the car's worth. The decision here is, do I really need to do a 100 point restoration or is a thorough inspection and mechanical rehabilitation with a cosmetic facelift in order? The only person who can answer this question is you.

Let's face it folks... we are a dying breed and the future of car collecting and car shows as we knew it appears to in the hands of the Japanese Tuners. There you will find your 30 year old Hondas, Acuras, Infinitis and Lexus cars tricked out with 5 inch exhausts, gull-wing doors, spoilers, groundeffects, wings and the all-important sound system that has enough bass to crack the pavement.

When it comes time to part with your car, sell it for what it is and not for what it used to be. Your car is an extension of you, so give it the personality it deserves. And, if that means a 100 point restoration just because you love it so much, then so be it. Just a word of caution in closing... Don't die before you either will your car or sell it. Your spouse will give it away just to get some extra storage space.

# PrezSez By Richie Hartley

### Do You Have Gas Problems?

We are getting in full swing on Taylors 1969 MGB roadster. We hosted a club tech session a couple of weeks ago, that was to cover changing

out the fuel tank on an MGB. This MGB had been sitting up since 1984 in a various garages and thankfully out of the weather. We could have cleaned the tank and recoated it, but a new replacement was our most logically choice. We also purchased a new mounting hardware kit, sending unit and gasket set. We ordered the tank and parts from Charleston Import Automotive. I typically do this for parts on the MGB or the Spitfire, as they help me with parts identification and making sure that I am getting the right part for the correct year. I am not as familiar with the Triumphs and the MGBs as I am with the Mini's. So we get the parts and now comes the hard part. We now have to remove the old tank. The tank is not the difficult part to remove from the car; it's the bolts that hold the tank in. There are four bolts on either side of the tank and four of them are studs with nuts that can be accessed from the underside of the boot. The other four bolts, screw into clip on nuts on the tank, and this typically is the difficult part. These bolts and clip on nuts get rusted and just spin when trying to remove them. Of course three out of our four bolts have to be very difficult, and we end up drilling them out. We placed a jack under the tank and continued removing the other bolts. After the bolts, the fuel line needs to be disconnected and the sending unit wiring. After the wiring, the fuel line, and the bolt removal, the tank can be lowered down and completely removed from under the car. Once the tank was out, we removed the new tank from its packaging and compared the tanks to ensure that we had the correct replacement. Thankfully we did and we also inspected the remainder of the packaging content that had the new hardware, sending unit and gaskets. Everything was in the box and correct. We did not install the new tank right away for a couple of reasons. First reason was the new tank is bare metal, and needs to be cleaned and painted. We are painting the tank with black primer and then we will coat the tank with a rubberized paint very similar to car undercoating. The second reason was that we are getting ready to do body work and paint on the MGB. We want to clean, prep and recoat the area, where the tank contacts the underside of the boot. When removing the tank, we found that the rear valance was dented and bent a little. Looks like maybe the previous owner got too close to something in backup mode. We will repair this valance prior to installing the new tank. Taylor has also purchased a new SU fuel pump for the MGB and we are in the process of checking all of the existing fuel lines in order to see if we need to replace them. Other than checking the lines, Taylor should not have any gas problems. With the car that is., LOL. We were planning on taking it to the Garrett adult auto body class this past week, but school was cancelled due to bad weather. There is not a lot of body work to be done; just a couple spots that need repair, and then it will be

ready for paint. We continue to find unique items with this model year MGB and welcome any information from our MGB members. FYI I continually refer to we in this article. This is because both Taylor and Samantha, my daughters, are working on this MGB. This is actually Taylor's car, but here sister is currently anxious in helping with the restoration. Wish us continuing luck.




